We connect to our clients and our communities by building stronger relationships, meaningful partnerships and exploring opportunities for collaboration.








It is my pleasure to introduce the 2020-21 George Jeffrey Children's Centre President's report.

George Jeffrey Children's Centre (GJCC) is a paediatric outpatient health facility located in Thunder Bay, Ontario.

We have been meeting the communication, developmental, and physical needs of children for over 60 years; providing services to infants, children, and adolescents aged birth to 19 years.

Our services also include Little George's Child Care Centre, located within Sherbrooke Public School. Little George's offers licensed full and part-time child care for children aged 18 months to five years of age and programming for school-aged children, six to 12 years of age.

KEYACTIVITIES

Even with COVID-19 related closures, GJCC employees continued to work hard behind the scenes to find new and safe ways to provide resources, supports and services during the pandemic. Staff quickly embraced virtual care and working remotely when our offices closed.

A new Family Orientation Manual was developed and launched.

Clinical team members worked together to transition to the provision of telerehabilitation services. This included extensive work on the development of guidelines and procedures.

Key staff training initiatives included; the provision of telerehabiliation services, monthly inhouse education sessions, therapeutic coaching and Indigenous cultural safety training.

Both the Centre and Little George's **Child Care Centre** hosted multiple student placements throughout the year.

The Lakehead District School Board, SLP team created a series of informative videos, a channel for parents of students on various pre-reading skills and developed information sheets for those who may not have access to technology.



In July 2020, George Jeffrey Children's Centre began delivering SBRS directly. Even through school closures, the SBRS team continued to provide virtual telerehabilitation options for students.

A new Youth Newsletter was launched and as the year progressed, the resumption of adolescent group programming.

GJCC Consultation Clinics expanded to offer services to SBRS clients and the SBRS team began to offer tiered intervention services.

The GJCC Facebook page was updated regularly with new content created by the clinical team. This included activity calendars, work on different areas of skill development and videos from clinicians presenting various strategies to work on specific areas of development.

Our Recreation program offered several recreation challenges to encourage participation in various activities and numerous programs into late summer including biking, yoga and hiking.

With the addition of SBRS services, collaboration occurred with the existing GJCC rural team to integrate all rural services.

Highlights 2020-2021



GJCC remains actively involved at all levels of the organization with Empowered Kids Ontario (EKO). Focus on this year has been on the development of fee-for-service models, related changes with the Ontario Autism Program (OAP) and more recently providing virtual services to clients and families. This included the development of extensive telerehabiliation practices.

In October 2020, the Board of George Jeffrey Children's Foundation welcomed a new Executive Director, Cindy Levanto-Kawahara. Cindy replaced Steve MacDonald who relocated back to Southern Ontario. GJCC was excited to have Cindy join the team.

GJCC is fortunate to have the continued support of the George Jeffrey Children's Foundation. We value our strong partnership with the Foundation staff, the support of the Foundation Board and their commitment to raising funds for programs and services offered at the Centre and Little George's Child Care Centre.

Funding

GJCCs main funders are the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services (MCCSS), The District of Thunder Bay Social Services Administration Board (TBDSSAB) and the George Jeffrey Children's Foundation.

We continue our contract with the Lakehead Public School Board for the delivery of Speech and Language Services. This year that program provided services to 686 individual clients.

GJCC submitted an application to the Emergency Community Response Fund (ECSF) to assist with our re-opening efforts in response to COVID-19. The "George Jeffrey Children's Centre - Commitment to Service" was supported by the Government of Canada's Emergency Community Support Fund, the Thunder Bay Community Foundation and the United Way of Thunder Bay. This grant supported computer and technology upgrades, IPads and a communication App for Little George's Child Care Centre and the installation of Plexiglas at our reception.

Building and Operations

We underwent major construction for remedial work on the roof. This work was completed at the end of March 2021.

We opened a new site. With the expansion of the SBRS and OAP services, combined with our commitment to ensuring more accessible service delivery, GJCC began exploring opportunities for another location.

In September 2020, GJCC entered into a partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of Thunder Bay to lease space at their Windsor Street location. We have started with some retrofits to the space and work will continue into 2021-22 to make the space our own.

Many thanks to the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club for offering some interim additional space at no additional cost for several months while we continued to assess our needs.

New Ontario Autism Program (OAP)

In early 2020, GJCC entered into a partnership with Child and Community Resources (CCR) to assist them with OAP Services. At that time, GJCC began taking on the provision of some of the existing OAP services that were being delivered directly through CCR. This included a small number of children who were participating in behavior plans.

GJCC, CCR and numerous other partners worked diligently over the course of 2020-21 to ensure autism services were preserved in the Thunder Bay District and delivered by trained professional staff.

In May 2020, GJCC welcomed 14 new professional staff to the organization to support the work of the Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) program. Virtual ABA services were provided during closure periods and in-person services resumed in early July 2020.

To date, the team has started some service within the school boards, offered parent sessions & client groups to 183 individuals and offered 78 caregiver sessions. GJCC has been an active participant with the CCRs Northern Collaborative initiative.

Many team members completed their Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) training and others continued to enhance their skills through various other training opportunities such as Pivotal Response Training (PRT) training, and the Program for the Education and Enrichment of Relational Skills (PEERS®).

GJCC continues to work actively to support the implementation of the new OAP program, expected to roll out over the course of 2021 by MCCSS. This includes offering publically funded services based on funding received from MCCSS and developing a fee-for-service autism program where publically funded services are not available.



Executive Director



The 2020-2021 year has been one for the books!

However, it's truly been an amazing first year as Executive Director of George Jeffrey Children's Foundation! I feel privileged to be fundraising for our local Children's Centre that provides programs and services for over 2,500 children and youth.

Because of the generosity of our donors, George Jeffrey Children's Centre has been able to:

- Fund a Care Co-ordinator pilot position that reduces administrative time required of our clinicians allowing them so spend more time with our children and their families;
- Purchase special physiotherapy bikes giving children the opportunity to ride a bike while being assisted by their care giver(s);
- Enhance the equipment loan program which enables children and their families to trial specific equipment and devices before spending a lot of money on an item that may not work or be helpful.

It's because of the continued generosity from people and organizations in our communities, that our Centre will become even MORE accessible when we convert 11 treatment rooms with dimming light switches.

Clinicians will be given the ability to dim lighting for assessment and treatment purposes, and clients who are blind and/or have low vision will benefit from the increased contrast between an object and the background, making the object more visible to them.
